Recovery Friendly Workplace (RFW) has recently launched a workforce development (WFD) "arm", which aims to better connect employers to job seekers in recovery, and vice versa, especially through collaboration and coordination with existing WFD programs and resources. **For employers who choose to work with us in this space, we can offer the following at no cost:**

- ▶ Assessment of current hiring needs and connection to the most relevant workforce development programs/offerings
- ▶ Acting as a liaison between employers, WFD programs, and job seekers to promote the most successful placements possible (e.g., through comparing an employer's job requirements to a candidate's background)
- ▶ Ongoing efforts to strengthen New Hampshire's WFD ecosystem and increase the number of successful placements of job seekers in recovery at RFWs, especially through continued collaboration and coordination with partners (e.g., recovery community organizations, recovery residences, etc.)
- ▶ Trainings and information on a variety of WFD topics to support employers in hiring and retaining job seekers in recovery
